POINTS IN RIGHT DIRECTION

When it comes to off-road vehicles which can also cut-it on Tarmac, Jeep has been doing it for donkey's years.

However, their latest models are specifically tuned to European tastes ...largely down to the influence of Fiat.

The latest example is the Jeep Compass and we think it looks rather smart

In terms of engine choice, any Fiat owners will recognise the names and the line-up. This is no bad thing because the engines are tried and tested and are reliable, economical and with a decent chunk of power.

If you want refinement, go for the petrol engines. They're 1.4 litre MultiAir units developing either 138bhp (45.6mpg) or 168bhp. For economy, try the MultiJet diesel engines. There's a 1.6 118bhp engine (64.2mpg) and a 2.0 litre diesel with 138 and 168bhp on tap. The bigger engines get 4x4 drive and the most powerful versions also get an auto box.

The best all-rounder is arguably the 138bhp diesel. You'll get 54.3mpg and a 0-60 time of around 10 seconds. Bearing in mind this is a chunky vehicle which has all-wheel drive and an ability to climb mountains, these are impressive figures.

There are four levels of trim...Sport, Longitude, Limited and, very shortly, Trailhawk which will be fully loaded and sit at the top of the range. Prices for the range start at £23,755.

Every Jeep Compass comes with air con, DAB radio, Bluetooth, powered and heated door mirrors, cruise control, electronic parking brake, lane departure warning and an impressive list of safety kit. We'd recommend moving up to Longitude trim which adds sat nav and a rear camera.

The interior of the Compass is a step up for Jeep. There's a premium feel about everything. The seats are comfy yet supportive, there's a stack of interior space and loads of cubby holes. The Compass is also rewarding to drive. The ride is on the firm-ish side at town speeds, but once you get out and about,



everything settles nicely. In other words, if you want to take the family to the beach or strap some bikes, surfboards, skis etc to the roof, and chuck a load of gear into the boot, then the Jeep Compass will be ideal.

When it comes to a family sized SUV with serious off-road ability, the Jeep Compass is a really good choice. Go and give it a test drive. If you've not driven or sat in a Jeep lately, you're in for a pleasant surprise.

1 Audi EV SUV

Here's a photo of the new Audi e-tron. It's their chunky all-electric SUV. Now image it shrinking to the size of something like the Audi Q3 and you will get an idea of what Audi's latest all electric car will look like. You will find that electric will be a big theme of this year's Geneva show.

2 BMW 7 Series

Can front grilles really get any bigger? They're starting to look like the chrome from the American 1950s cars. Anyway, this is the latest Beemer flagship. You can expect a host of interior changes which will all be incredibly hi-tech. There may be an appearance of the X7 too which BMW sees as their Range Rover rival.





3 Volkswagen Buggy

Remember the Dune Buggy from the 1960s which generally had a VW Beetle engine strapped onto the rear? Well this is the latest take on that theme from Volkswagen. It will be an electric car and, although it's being designed as a concept, VW is keen to move into any area where it feels as though sales can be gained. Underneath will be something that could easily become a new Up!



4 Bentley Centenary Edition

At the moment, all we have is a photo of the car's grille. It looks like a Bentley Continental GT. It's to celebrate their landmark centenary year in 2019 which takes place on 10th of July. You can expect an absolute flying machine which is likely to be a limited edition. It's interesting that there appears to be a number 9 painted onto the grille which harks back to the famous Blower Bentleys



5 Penault Clio

This is such an important car for Renault and is the fifth generation of the Clio which regularly tops the sales charts across Europe for its particular size. An RS version will be available from launch. Renault is aiming to follow a popular trend which allows customers to create a unique car. There will be 8 different interior design schemes and 10 exterior colours.



6 Toyota Supra

The return of a legend. The Supra is finally going to officially break cover in Europe. You can actually place an order now...deliveries start late summer. Power comes from a 3.0-litre in-line six-cylinder engine, producing up to 335bhp. It promises terrific performance. 0-60 takes just over four seconds. Prices start at £52.695

7 SKODA Kamiq

This will be SKODA's smallest SUV. We actually saw it for the first time last year when it was called the Vision X. You can expect a choice of petrol and diesel power and, as with all SKODA's it'll be cracking value. It's due to go on sale late summer / early autumn.

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HONDA SAYS HELLO TO HYBRID CR-V

The Honda CR-V first appeared on our shores in 1995. It reigns as the world's best-selling SUV. However, even Honda say this latest development is one of their biggest steps ever in the model's history; Honda has dumped diesel engines and replaced them with a petrol hybrid which will be sold alongside the other CR-V models, all of which are powered by a 1.5 litre petrol i-VTEC engine.

The hybrid system combines two electric motors, a battery and a 143bhp 2.0-litre i-VTEC petrol engine. It gives the CR-V Hybrid lively performance with 0-60 mph taking under 9 seconds for the front wheel drive model, and just over 9 seconds for the AWD. Top speed is

But when it comes to economy, you can understand why Honda has ditched diesel. Not only does the Honda CR-V Hybrid have low emissions, it has low fuel consumption too in the region of 53mpg. It's also impressive to note that the CR-V Hybrid is only £800 more than its 'standard' petrol stablemates of similar

The electronic gadgetry continually switches the CR-V Hybrid between running purely on electric battery power, and a combination of battery and petrol engine. At town speeds, you glide away

in silent EV (Electric Vehicle) battery mode. You can travel for 1.2 miles on battery power alone before the petrol engine cuts in. At this point you move into Hybrid Drive, where the engine supplies power to a generator which supplies the electric motors. If you need a serious burst of power or are travelling at higher speeds, the hybrid system will use the engine to power the wheels. The driver is completely unaware of all this... you simply drive along and the CR-V hybrid system takes care of everything... seamlessly.

At a steady 40mph, the CR-V Hybrid will typically run in EV mode for more than half of the time. At 62mph the car will be in EV Drive for approximately one third of the time, whilst achieving the CR-V's maximum speed, the car will run in Hybrid

The new model raises the bar in terms of



premium feel. It's comfortable and loaded with hi-tech kit. All versions of the CR-V Hybrid are equipped with 18-inch alloy wheels. Top-grade cars get a panoramic glass sunroof.

Billy Taylor - General Manager for Vertu Honda

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PEUGEOT - A CAR FOR ALL REASONS

Have you looked closely at Peugeot lately?

No....well...you don't know what you're missing because the rate at which Peugeot is launching new models is staggering.

For example, almost every model has now got an SUV in its range. Only the funky 108 hatchback city car misses out.

At the top of the Peugeot range, there's the 508 and the imposing 7-seater 5008 SUV while at the other end of the range you'll find the 208 and it's versatile 2008 SUV stablemate.

Need something in between? Go and check out the Peugeot 308 and, you guessed it, the 3008 SUV.

The Peugeot 3008 has been a terrific success. It manages to combine the school run, shopping trips and the daily commute, with long holiday jaunts and outings to the beach loaded to the gunwales with the family and all of its inevitable clobber.

As with every Peugeot, the 3008 is

supremely comfortable, but don't assume that it's gone all soft on the fun scale; it is thoroughly enjoyable to drive. The chassis manages to soak up lumps and bumps at low speed while remaining sufficiently controlled to allow a keen driver to have some fun. The interior is a work of art and the i-Cockpit fascia works really well. It looks very 21st Century. You'll find loads of room for 5 people and there's a premium feel to all of the materials used.

The Peugeot 3008 SUV starts at £24,575 for the petrol engine 1.2 litre PureTech Active model. If you prefer diesel, the 1.5 BlueHDi Active 3008 starts at £26,495.

However, although the GT-Line and rapid GT models are very tempting, we reckon the best value, and the best compromise, is to be found in the 3008 Allure.

We'd go for the powerful 130bhp 1.5

BlueHDI engine with Allure trim. You get additional kit including sat nav, tinted windows, reversing camera, parking sensors front and rear, Bluetooth, powered windows and mirrors (heated), and the Peugeot driver safety pack which includes blind spot detector and lane departure warning. You will get 67mpg and a 0-60 time of under 11 seconds, although the car feels quicker thanks to the low-end torque which means you get effortless performance.

Since its launch, the Peugeot 3008 SUV has won more than 60 international awards, including the prestigious European Car of the Year Award. This is one of the best cars Peugeot has ever produced and it's available now for a test drive at Wingrove Peugeot on Benton Road in Newcastle.

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SPACE CRUSER

If you place comfort and refinement at the top of your requirements when looking for a new car, then you needn't go any further than Citroen.

Every one of their models thrives on giving occupants a cushy ride.

Sometimes though, you need some serious space to take an entire family, plus their baggage on a holiday trip. Of course, you still want some style and you like the SUV convenience of a chunky appearance but with hatchback versatility.

If those are things you look for, you'll love the brand new Citroen C5 Aircross.

Prices start at £23,225 which means it already looks like decent value for what is a sizeable vehicle. Inside there is loads of room for five people; a 7-seater is in the pipeline. You're surrounded by top quality materials and loads of storage space.

In terms of engine choices you can go for petrol or diesel. There are two petrol

engines; 129bhp 1.2 litre and 178bhp 1.6 litres. If you prefer diesel, you also two options; 129bhp 1.5 litre or 158bhp 2.0 litre. Both diesels will crack 60mpg. The 2.0 litre model is lively with 0-60 taking a shade over 8 seconds.

If economy isn't you're ultimate target, then we'd recommend the petrol engines because they are uncannily quiet and very smooth. They make for relaxed cruising. Having said that, the 1.2 litre petrol motor is really thrifty, managing 55mpg. 0-60 takes just over 10 seconds and, for the majority of owners, it will be the ideal car. However, if you intend to travel regularly with a full load of passengers and gear, you'd be better off with the bigger engines. The 1.6 litre petrol unit will still achieve 49 mpg, but you're 0-60 time drops to around 8

seconds. It makes for effortless motoring with loads of pulling power and effortless overtaking.

In terms of trim, you can choose from Feel, Flair and Flair Plus. Every C5 Aircross has a high level of standard specification with air con, smart touchscreen with DAB radio, rear parking sensors, and powered windows and mirrors all included. We'd go for Flair trim though because it adds sat nav, really smart alloy wheels, tinted rear windows, front foglights which feature a clever cornering function, and a host of safety items. It's worth the extra outlay.

The best idea is to go along to Wingrove's Citroen dealerships at the Silverlink in Wallsend or the West Road in Newcastle. Take a C5 Aircorss for a drive. See what all the fuss is about.







In conversation with Michael Gray

It rarely happens these days in top flight football...local youngster, grows up supporting their local team....ends up playing for them...and becomes a legend with the supporters in the stands where they once sat, or stood as is more likely.

That's what happened to Michael 'Micky' Gray.

Although it might not have happened because while he was playing schoolboy football, he was taken on by Manchester Utd and signed schoolboy forms. However, the lure of playing for his home town club was too strong and he returned to Wearside. He continued playing for Fatfield Juniors F.C. in the Hetton Youth League until, when he was 16, he joined Sunderland.

On the 21st November 1992, Michael made his debut for Sunderland at Derby. Sunderland won 1-nil...Don Goodman got the goal. By 1996 he was a regular and had the experience of not only being in the side that won promotion into the newly formed Premier League, he also scored Sunderland's first goal in the top flight. He scored the opener in a 4-1 win at Nottingham Forest.

In the following seasons he would win three England gaps after being picked by Kevin Keegan. He would rack-up a total of over 550 games in a career which took him from Sunderland to Celtic, Blackburn Rovers, Leeds Utd, Wolves and Sheffield Wednesday.

Nowadays, Michael talks about football. He's frequently seen on TV with BT Sport, ITV and beIN sports who're based in Doha, and can be found on a regular basis covering football matches and appearing as a studio guest on talkSPORT radio.

He still plays on a regular basis in various 'Legends' tournaments. He's also a regular at the Great North Run.

But, what about another of his passions away from football. Cars. We caught up with Michael and fired a few motoring questions in his direction.

What is the first car you can remember?

I can clearly remember my parents Datsun Sunny. It was brilliant white and I thought it was wonderful. I used to sit in it while parked outside our house pretending to drive it thinking I'm gonna own one of these someday. To a young lad it looked so cool and I can still remember what it smelt like inside



What was the first car you owned?

The first car I actually paid my own money for was a Ford XR2. It had extra driving lights at the front and natty white alloy wheels. I was only 17 years old when I bought it and I think the insurance was more than the cost of the car. I suppose I wasn't a very good risk....young lad, footballer, sporty car...not a good mix. And I think the XR2 had a reputation of being nicked too easily. Anyway, I thought it looked great and fitted loads of extra loudspeakers so that I could blast the music. Good God... what was I thinking?









Smart car or a mobile skip?

Don't tell my parents this one...they were really proud of their cars (still are) and keep them in immaculate condition. I have to confess that my car interior is a bit of an embarrassment. You should see the look on people's faces when I offer to give them a lift. They have to shovel a load of junk off the seat. To say it's a messy car is being polite. Here's my excuse. Working in the media means you spend a lot of time driving to grounds so everything just gets thrown in the back...coffee cups are the main culprit. It's not a good look.

And motoring embarrassments?

On the very first day I'd picked up my XR2, I collected my mates and went out driving. Obviously I wanted to show them how quick it was. I drove up to a roundabout going far too quickly and left the braking too late. You won't be surprised to know that the outcome was inevitable. We went straight on and hurtled over the top of it and back onto the road on the other side. A lesson learned

What's your favourite road trip?

I'm not really a road trip person...I wouldn't go on a driving holiday abroad. It doesn't appeal. I tend to see a car as a means of getting from A to B as quickly and as comfortably as possible. Having said that, I've driven in a few foreign countries not knowing where I'm going and got horribly lost without being able to speak a word of the local lingo. I have to admit though on a gloriously sunny day.... shorts on...roof down... and I'll drive until the petrol light comes on.

Steady Eddy or a bit of a speedster?

I've always been a bit of a speed junky... still am. Give me an open road and my foot gets heavier. All of this probably explains why I'm sitting on 9 points right now and have had to ease off.

Favourite road in the North East?

Got to be the A19, except at peak times. It's not really the road itself, it's more of the occasion. When I'm on it, it invariably means I've been back home on Wearside. And I know it sounds naff, but you can't beat winding down the window and breathing in some good North East fresh air.

What have been your favourite cars?

My favourite car has to be the Range Rover. I've had about 6 of them. They're the best car on the road by day. You've got a commanding driving position, plenty of oomph and loads of space. Brilliant. In my younger days I had plenty of sports cars such as the Aston Martin Vanquish, 4 Ferraris, a Porsche 911 Turbo but I have to confess that I'd probably need a crowbar to get me out of them these days. Which is another reason why I like the Range Rovers.

Worst Car?

I had an old BMW 325 Cabriolet. It looked great on the day I bought it. Somehow, before I knew it, it was just a heap of rust. Huge mistake. It got scrapped.



And finally....your dream car?

Right now it'd have to be the Mercedes AMG G63 in white. Massive presence and they sound fantastic. I love them.

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CHANGE UP TO AN ECOSPORT

The demand for Sports Utility Vehicles (SUVs) has soared over the past decade. No surprise therefore that Ford has upped its game with their new EcoSport.

Put it this way, if you drove or sat in the previous EcoSport, forget everything. This latest model is a massive leap forward in terms of interior design, exterior features and driving enjoyment.

Some things haven't changed. The interior is still roomy and the raised ride height still gives you a commanding view of the road.

Prices for the Ford EcoSport start at £17,495. You can choose from a 1.0-litre EcoBoost petrol engine which is available with three outputs from 99bhp to 138bhp, or a 1.5-litre EcoBlue diesel engine which delivers 99bhp or 123bhp.

The one we like is the 123bhp diesel engine. It offers a really good blend of performance and economy. 0-60mph takes a shade over 11 seconds, and you'll manage 47.1 mpg. You can choose between manual and auto 'boxes. There's even all-wheel-drive as an option. This will



be really handy for anyone who lives out in the sticks because AWD and the lofty ground clearance will be useful on country lanes or in bad weather.

If you want outstanding economy, head for the 99bhp 1.5 litre diesel and you'll get close to 60mpg. Wow.

In terms of how the new Ford EcoSport handles, this is where you spot a big difference in the latest model. The entire suspension set-up has been reengineered to fit our European roads. It will now happily soak-up potholed city streets on the school run, or easily cruise along at motorway speeds, loaded to the

gunwales for a family outing.

In terms of trim, there are four levels; Zetec, Titanium and, for the first time in the EcoSport ST-line. There's even an ST-Line Black edition. Unless you want the sporty appearance of the ST-Line, we'd recommend the Titanium trim which gives you an 8inch, centrally mounted infotainment screen, sat nav, air con, powered windows and mirrors, cruise control, auto lights and wipers, rear view camera, rear parking sensors, leather trim, and really smart alloys. The audio system, which also concludes DAB radio, is terrific.

The new Ford EcoSport is the sort of car that will become a family friend or a commuter and shopping tool. It's well priced, well equipped, comfortable and good to drive. In other words, if you're in the market for buying an SUV, you need to go along to your local Lookers Ford showroom and check out the Ford EcoSport.

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KIA SOWS THE CEED OF SUCCESS

Kia is a company on a mission. Over the past twelve months, a large chunk of their range has been updated.

Gone are the days when the chief reason for buying a Kia was because of their 7 year / 100,000 mile warranty. Their cars are comfortable, well priced, roomy and reliable, and come with a decent level of kit as standard. They're good to drive and stylish.

Take the brand new Kia Ceed for example.

The Kia Ceed is designed and built in Europe so it suits our roads perfectly. You can choose from petrol or diesel power. In terms of petrol engines, there's a 118 bhp 1.0 litre, 3-cylinder (from £18,295) or 138bhp 1.4 litre turbo and, most recently, a 1.6 litre unit which develops a punchy 201bhp. If you prefer diesels, there's a 1.6

litre unit which starts at £19,545. Don't be fooled by the size of the 1.0 litre petrol engine though. It packs a punch with 0-60 taking around 10 seconds yet still managing over 50mpg. The 1.4 litre model is likely to be the main seller in the UK. With a 0-60 time of 8.9 seconds, it feels quick. If you prefer stunning economy, head for the 1.6 diesel and you'll get 74.3mpg. Both bigger engines have an auto gearbox option.

In terms of specification, every Kia Ceed comes with air con, electric windows all round, reversing camera, DAB radio, Bluetooth and a stack of safety kit. It represents great value for money. There's a terrific choice in terms of trim but we'd recommend that you don't go daft; opt

for the level 3 which adds sat nav, bigger and seriously handsome alloy wheels, dark tinted rear windows, heated and folding door mirrors. It's all you really need to make a good package feel a bit more special.

If you need extra space, go for the Sportswagon (Kia's word for what the rest of us call an estate) which starts at £19,295 and if you want a Sportswagon with additional style and sporty handling characteristics, go for the ProCeed. (£23,835).

Along with the new Ceed, Kia has recently introduced new Sportage. Optima, Stinger, Stonic and Sorento models. Go and check them out. You'll be surprised.

Blackshaws celebrates centenary

A locally-based family car dealership is celebrating its Centenary this year.

Blackshaws of Alnwick and Morpeth has been established in the area for ten decades during which time the world has changed beyond all recognition and early 'automobiles' have completely transformed into the technologically-advanced hybrid, electric and even driverless vehicles we see today.

As Blackshaws takes a moment to look back over the last century, it would like to share its fascinating story with the local community. The company's long and enviable heritage began in Tower Lane, Alnwick in 1919 when it was founded by brothers John Charles and Edward Warren Blackshaw at a time when the horse and carriage was still the most common form of transport.

Six years later the business which sold Riley, Clyno and Leyland Trojan cars, moved to Bondgate Without in the centre of Alnwick where it remained as a familiar landmark to town residents for almost 80 years.

After the Second World War, John Charles's son William Dixon Blackshaw inherited the business and gradually expanded the site which was by now a British Leyland dealership. In the 1950s 'Dick' as he was better known, acquired additional land in front of the garage and promptly converted it into a Cleveland petrol station.

Tragically Dick Blackshaw passed away prematurely in 1977 after a short illness and the Blackshaw business was handed over to his relatively young sons Stuart and David who became the third-generation owners, while the adjoining petrol station was left to youngest son Richard.

Over the next two decades the Blackshaw brothers changed the dealership franchise and formed strong new business partnerships with the Japanese car manufacturers Nissan (formerly Datsun) and Suzuki.

In the 1990s there was also a change in the company ownership when Stuart and David decided to dissolve their 25 year partnership with Stuart leaving to set up a used car business in north Northumberland.

The approach of the new millennium saw fourth-generation family members Jill



and William Blackshaw join the business followed by Richard who by then had sold the adjoining petrol station.

In the 2000s due to access difficulties and lack of space in Bondgate Without Blackshaws took the momentous decision to relocate the Alnwick dealership into a purpose-built site on the Lionheart Enterprise Park at the edge of town.

In the first decade of the 21st century the company also established a successful Vauxhall and Suzuki dealership in Berwick-upon-Tweed which was later sold as a going concern after the company was approached with an offer to buy the site in 2010.

In 2016 following several years of buoyant trading as a single-site dealership fourth-generation owners William and Jill Blackshaw felt the time was right for further expansion and a new Mitsubishi car dealership was opened by the company on the Coopies Lane industrial area on the outskirts of Morpeth.

Reflecting on 100 years of history William and Jill Blackshaw sum up the feelings of the six members of the Blackshaw family who still work in the business today and also describe how they hope to commemorate the company's Centenary.

"We feel very proud of our heritage and although Blackshaws has grown significantly over the years we are still very much a friendly, family business routed in the local community.

"We are immensely grateful for all the support we've received over the last century from our employees, customers, suppliers, franchise partners and also the community in general.

"So much so, that during our Centenary year we'd like to give something back. For many years we have undertaken fund-raising activity in aid of HospiceCare North Northumberland and this year we hope to raise more than we've ever done before by donating a Suzuki Swift as a raffle prize.

"One hundred per cent of the ticket money will go to HospiceCare to help with the wonderful work they do caring for people in our area in times of most need."

In addition to Blackshaws 100th Year Celebration Raffle the company plans to mark its Centenary with a series of special events throughout the year.

A spectacular party for staff and their partners at Alnwick Castle Guest Hall is taking place in February followed by a party for customers in the spring to mark the opening of Blackshaws expanded car showroom and the launch of the Mitsubishi range at its Alnwick dealership.

In the summer Blackshaws will also host a vintage car and stunt driving event with motoring stunt celebrity Paul Swift and the year will culminate in a charity Winter Fair when the Suzuki car raffle prize will be drawn.

The company certainly intends it to be a year to remember.



The latest Range Rover Sport has been given a host of upgrades which, quite frankly, has made it better than ever.

At the top of the range you'll still find the totally nuts 567bhp SVR 5.0 litre V8 Supercharged petrol model. You'll hurtle to the horizon with a 0-60 time of 4.3 seconds and a top speed of 176mph.

Further down the engine range, if you want a smooth petrol engine and decent economy, try the 296 bhp 2.0 litre petrol engine. 0-60 in 7 seconds. For even better economy...you'll crack 30mpg...go for the 3.0 litre V6 diesel which does the 0-60 dash in 6.8 seconds.

However, the latest model to arrive is the Range Rover Sport PHEV (Plug-in Hybrid Electric Vehicle). If you want performance AND economy, this is the one to go for.

As with most hybrids, you get a clever set of gadgetry which sees a 2.0 litre petrol engine working in tandem with batteries and electric motors. SEXPRESS

When the Jaguar F-Pace was launched, it created a bit of a stir. This was a Jaguar that you could use to take your garden rubbish to the tip.

Even better, you could load it to the gunwales and take your entire family, including the Labrador, to the beach or on a fortnight's holiday to the South of France

It has been a massive success. Our favourite? We like the F-Pace S

The S model is powered by a 3.0 litre V6 twin turbo diesel which chucks out 296bhp. It comes with permanent 4-wheel drive and an 8-speed automatic gearbox. Prices start at

£54,440. Performance is good...0-60 takes 6.2 seconds; top speed is 150mph. Go steadily and you won't be far away from 40mpg.

It looks really cool...stylish, with a mildly threatening stance. It has near perfect 50-50 weight distribution and handles superbly for a big car. The F-Pace is also surprisingly nimble off-road and will easily cope with hauling a horsebox across a soggy field or reversing a boat into a lake

As for the interior, the quality of fit and materials used are top notch. The seats



are extremely comfortable and, for those in the back, don't worry about an obstructed view because the height of the seat has been raised. This is especially important for children who don't like to feel hemmed-in. Here's a good idea; the boot floor is reversible. One side is carpeted; flip it over and it's rubberised for when you throw in a heap of dirty gear. Neat.

In terms of kit, we shan't bother with the list because you get everything that you could possibly need including a really impressive standard of safety kit. The audio system is superb. There is also a huge options list which includes massive 22 inch wheels. Granted, they look good and fill the wheel arches, but they do tend to make the ride a tad more fidgety.

Overall though the Jaguar F-Pace S is terrific to drive and ride around in. It's also reasonably priced when compared to the competition, spec for spec.

You can have some serious fun on the way back from the tip.





BACK TO THE FUTURE AT TOYOTA.

ICONS RETURN

These are important times for Toyota because 2019 will see a raft of new vehicles appearing, many with names that you will recognise. Later in the year the thunderous Supra returns to these shores and, if you want a sizeable saloon, the Toyota Camry will be worth waiting for.





First up though are arguably the two most important cars...the new RAV4 and the iconic Corolla.

The RAV4 is already on sale starting at £29,635. Toyota has had huge success with their range of hybrid cars so it's no surprise that they're going make the new RAV4 hybrid only. Power comes from a 2.5 litre petrol engine mated to their tried and tested to their electric hybrid system. All models come with an automatic gearbox. There are four trims available at the moment…Icon, Design, Excel and Dynamic…and they are all, apart from the entry level Icon, available with four-wheel drive.

0-60 takes a shade over 8 seconds. You'll crack 50mpg without too much trouble.

In terms of kit, every RAV4 comes with air con, front parking sensors, powered windows and mirrors, rear view camera, DAB radio, Bluetooth, height adjustment to the driver's seat and steering wheel, and really smart alloy wheels.

It's comfy, good to drive, looks smart inside and out, and should be a really good family SUV which will also scramble over boggy ground and rutted surfaces. And it'll be ultra-reliable.

As will the new Toyota Corolla. There are two body styles to choose from; fivedoor hatch or five-door estate called Touring Sports. Two engines are available in the Corolla range... both petrol hybrids. For economy, go for the 1.8 litre 121bhp engine. For extra performance, opt for the 2.0 litre 178bhp unit. All models have an automatic gearbox.

0-60 in the 1.8 litre model is 10.9 seconds, while the 2.0 litre model dips under 8 seconds. Fuel economy will be the name of the game so expect at least 80mpg from the ultra-efficient 1.8 litre model.

There are four trim levels - Icon, Icon Tech, Design and Excel. Icon trim includes 16" alloys, automatic LED headlights, heated front seats, 8" multimedia touchscreen, reversing camera, DAB radio and air conditioning. We like the Icon Tech trim because this adds satellite navigation, voice control and parking sensors.

The Corolla is great to drive. It corners with assurance and the ride is uncannily smooth. The 2.0 litre model is genuinely sporty. The hybrid system is conventional so, at town speeds you will ride along in silence. When the engine bursts into life, it's hardly audible at all. This is relaxed family motoring at its best. Prices start at £23,750 for the hatchback; add £1270 for the estate version.

As the Corolla replaces the Auris, later this year will see the Toyota Camry replace the Avensis. The Camry is a family sized saloon and returns to the UK for the first time in around fifteen years.



However, the Camry never went away from the Toyota range. It's one of Toyota's biggest sellers in the USA. However, don't assume that this is going to be American cars converted to right hand drive. Toyota promises that the new Camry will be tuned to European tastes where we experience faster driving on more twisty roads.

In terms of power, the trend for hybrids will continue. A 2.5 litre petrol engine will be mated to Toyota's clever hybrid system. This should suit the Camry really well because it promises relaxed motoring on faster roads with the advantage of excellent fuel economy figures. This should not only be of interest to families but also to fleet buyers. 0-60 in 8.3 seconds and 65mpg...what's not to like?

And finally, summer can't come fast enough for lovers of serious sports cars because that is when the new Toyota Supra arrives. Power comes from a 3.0-litre in-line six-cylinder engine, producing up to 335bhp. It promises terrific performance. 0-60 takes just over four seconds. Prices start at £52,695 for the Toyota Supra which, bearing in mind the hi-tech nature of the car and what it will deliver, is actually decent value. And it looks drop-dead gorgeous.

Did you know that according to the Office for National Statistics, the average weekday commute for UK drivers is around 10 miles. Throw in a few diversions on the school run or to the shops and let's call it 120 miles per working week.

The e-Golf is Volkswagen's all-electric, battery powered version of one of the UK's most successful and popular cars. You have all of the traditional Golf attributes like quality of build, reliability, comfort, interior space and high standard of specification, but without a petrol or diesel engine under the bonnet.

All you have to do on Sunday evening is plug the e-Golf into your household mains via a 3pin plug, leave it to gently charge for around 12 hours....and bingo, you're ready for a working week of cheap motoring. You can have a fast charger installed or, if vou have one at work, it allows you to reach an 80 per cent charge in 45 minutes.

You are also exempt from road fund tax and won't have to pay congestion charge tolls. Business users can benefit from income tax advantages too.

Apart from all of that, the Volkswagen e-



lively too with 0-60 mph taking only 9.5 seconds because, unlike with a petrol or diesel engine where you need to allow the revs to rise before reaching peak power, you have 100 per cent power with an electric car...instantly.

PERFECT ALL-ROUNDER

The Tiguan is a really important car for Volkswagen. It's their third biggest seller in the UK behind the Golf and Polo. Consequently, when the time came to launch the latest edition of the Tiguan, VW was cautious in terms of the exterior styling.

That's no bad thing because the Tiguan is instantly recognisable. It's a tad wider and longer but it has a lower roof line, all of which makes the new Tiguan look more hunky.

Further up the trim range sees the arrival of a 148bhp petrol unit, a 187bhp diesel engine and a powerful but smooth, 2.0 litre petrol engine which delivers 227bhp.



The recently launched Match trim will be the most popular using the 148bhp diesel engine (58.9mpg, 0-60 in 9.3 seconds and a top speed of 127mph), but there's something about the R-Line. It makes the Tiguan stand out from the crowd. You get 20inch alloys, side skirts, wheel arch extensions, sports seats, sat nav, air con, brilliant audio system with DAB etc. In fact, there's nothing you need to add expect deciding whether you want the

benefit of 4MOTION all-wheel drive. If you do you'll need a further £1890.

There are currently five levels of trim. Everything kicks off with the T-Roc S at £19,270, powered by a 1.0 litre 114bhp TSi petrol engine using a 6-speed manual gearbox. It's lively too. 0-60 takes 10 seconds but you'll still manage around 55mpg

The S trim includes air conditioning, heated door mirrors, height adjustment to the front seats, electric windows allround, remote central locking, tyre pressure monitor and a brilliant audio system which comes with DAB radio and the facility to play MP3s through the USB socket. The 8inch colour touch-screen looks really smart and very hi-tech.

You also get an extensive list of safety gadgetry including lane assist (it tells you if you're wandering from your lane), front assist (it applies the brakes automatically in an emergency) and a host of air bags. The T-Roc is one of the safest cars ever built by Volkswagen.

For a bigger choice of engines, move up to the VW T-Roc SE (from £20,935). How about something like the seriously powerful 1.5 litre TSi petrol engine which whisks you to 60mph in a shade over 8 seconds yet will still crack the 50mpg barrier. You can also opt for a 7-speed automatic gearbox.

Our favourite trim is the VW T-Roc Design which sits below the top of the range SEL and R-Line. It allows you to customise your T-Roc with neat touches like a contrasting roof colour, different coloured alloy wheels and a variety of fascia and seat trims.
