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RATION Brand new ZR-V now on sa

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The ZR-V is one of a host of new models coming through at Honda...and it's perfectly timed because it bridges the gap between the HR-V and the CR-V, blending sporting looks, high levels of practicality and a premium interior.

It's arrived in Honda showrooms and, even though we tested the ZR-V recently, we already knew it would be good to drive.

How did we know that?

Simple...because the oily bits are based on the excellent Honda Civic.

Which means you get a 181 bhp 2.0 litre petrol engine mated to a full hybrid system with power going to the front wheels via a CVT gearbox. There's no need to charge the battery because the car charges itself as you go along with the engine mainly working as a generator. Clever huh?

0-60 takes a shade over 8 seconds. As for mpg, the beauty of a hybrid is that you can trundle around town for shortish distances while using battery power only. Consequently, you don't use any petrol. You glide along in near silence. Official overall consumption is 49.6mpg for general day-to-day motoring.

And because there's a lot of Honda Civic DNA running through the ZR-V, it means the car has a well-controlled ride which finds the happy compromise between firm enough on the quicker stuff but sufficiently supple to absorb lumps and bumps on our pothole-strewn town and side roads. You get four driving modes... Eco / Normal / Snow / Sport...we just left it in Normal.

There are three trim levels...Elegance, Sport and Advance. They all come with sat nav, air con, DAB radio, heated and folding mirrors, heated front seats, front and rear parking sensors, reversing camera, LED lights front and rear, adaptive cruise control and smart alloy wheels. Not much else you need really.

Prices start at £39,495.

The ZR-V joins a Honda line-up which is regularly updated and renewed.



Coming up later this year there will be a new CR-V which, for the first time in the UK, gets PHEV power.

The incredibly popular Honda Jazz has also been refreshed and now comes with an e:HEV full hybrid powertrain. Power comes from a 96bhp 1.5 litre petrol engine which gives you a 0-60 time of 8.6 seconds. Use the hybrid system to its full extent and you'll crack the 60mpg barrier.

It rates as one of the most comfortable small cars we've ever tried.

These are exciting times for Honda with the arrival of other new models like the fully electric e:Ny1 SUV. The Civic, Type R and HR-V go from strength to strength and the Honda e is one the best and cutest all-electric cars around.

Yep, they're changing gear at Honda.

In 1899, a chap called Ernest Clement Skurray sold an Accles Turrell car from an old chapel building in Swindon.

Bentley can do no wrong at the moment. They continue to shatter production and profitability records.



Their five models...Continental GT, Continental GT Convertible, Flying Spur, Bentayga and Bentayga EWB...all sell like hot cakes. Bentayga leads the way and is the most popular model, the appeal of which was increased with the addition of a long-wheelbase model which, to our eyes anyway, has made the Bentayga even more handsome.

Bentley is also the master at creating special editions...some of which spread across the range while others are standalone, coachbuilt models. All of them are incredibly desirable.

One of the most popular editions to the Bentley range has been the driver-focussed Speed models. They're available in all but the Bentayga EWB.

Speed models are really a nod to the heritage of Bentley's tremendous W12 engine which has been with us for 20 years. With 6.0 litres under your right foot and around 650bhp to play with, they are arguably the models to go for. You also get a selection of different colours and design options for both the interior and exterior. As for performance, in something like the Continental GT Speed Convertible, the W12 engine ensures 0-60 comes up in 3.6 seconds. Top speed is 208mph. We drove one last year at Silverstone. It sounds fantastic and the all-wheel drive and all-wheel steering makes for incredible roadholding.

However, for the ultimate Bentley, you





need to try to get your hands on one of the Mulliner models. We've already had the open top Bacalar but coming up shortly will be the Batur which Bentley refer to as their ultimate grand tourer. Development work is now complete and the first customer cars are being assembled. 18 will be made. Needless to say that they'll feature an exceptional level of bespoke craftsmanship. They'll take around four months to handcraft. The last one is due to be completed at the end of 2024.

Performance is stunning for this size of car. The W12 engine has been used but it now develops 730bhp. And look closely at the design features because the Batur is seen as the future shape of Bentley. The company says the Batur 'reflects the future of Bentley's design vision, offering a sleeker, more minimal and more focused interpretation of automotive luxury.'

The bottom line is that every Bentley is a pure joy to own and drive. Yes they sit at the pinnacle of automotive luxury but they're also totally usable....make for wonderful day to day motoring...and will continue to rate as the most soughtafter luxury car brand in the world.

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CLUBMAN SAYS GOODBYE. THE MINI FUTURE IS ELECTRIC.

We've always thought the MINI Clubman with its funky barn-like rear doors, is one of the best-looking cars in the MINI range.

However, MINI has confirmed that the Clubman sales will cease in 2024 and the last model, appropriately called the Final Edition, has now rolled off the assembly line. Only 1969 have been built....1969 was the year when the original MINI Clubman appeared.

The car has a MINI Cooper S 176bhp engine and comes fully loaded. Prices start at £37,000 and, if you fancy one, you'll need to get a move on because only 100 examples will be coming to the UK. Of course, there are other versions of the MINI Clubman available but your options will start to dwindle over the coming months. Prices for the range kick off at $\pm 27,440$.

So, why make this change?

Simple. MINI is planning to be an electric-only range by 2030. Some models in the range will disappear while others get the EV treatment.

The 3-door MINI hatchback was first to be available as fully electric and it has

recently been joined by the Electric Convertible which looks realty smart. Already in the pipeline is the all-electric Countryman and there's rumoured to be a smaller SUV called the Aceman which will, in effect, replace the departing Clubman.

If you want a halfway house, the MINI Countryman with a PHEV powertrain is a great choice. If you go easily, you can travel for around 25 miles on battery power only. So, if you have a daily commute of, say, 20 miles, you can easily do the while journey without the petrol engine bursting into life. Plug the car into a charger when you get home and it'll be ready for the morning.

Without doubt though, the 3-door MINI



but it drives superbly with a 0-60 time of 7.3 seconds. And yes, it still has the MINI trademark skateboard handling characteristics. The range of up to 143 miles will be sufficient for most people doing a Monday-Friday work or schoo shuttle. With prices starting at £32,550



it's a MINI, it'll hold onto its value like a limpet. It comes fully equipped to Cooper S standard which includes sat nav that can lead you to the nearest charging station. MINI currently has a deal which gives you the chance to have a home charger installed for free.

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THE LEGEND FOR THE 21ST CENTURY New BMW 5 Series breaks cover

Very few cars can be seen as a standard bearer for a particular sector of the automotive market, but when it comes to executive saloon and estate cars, the BMW 5 Series is a world leader.

Consequently, when the time comes to replace it, BMW needs to be extremely careful. It's a case of evolution rather than revolution.

Which means, as you can see from the photos, the new BMW 5 Series...the 8th generation... is instantly recognisable. The styling changes aren't as radical as some of the other BMW models. The saloon goes on sale very shortly while the estate (Touring) arrives next year.

However, things are very different under the skin. The biggest change is that the 5 Series will be available as an all-electric i5. Petrol and plug-in hybrid versions continue. There's no diesel now because BMW wants to concentrate on high efficiency petrol and hybrid models.

The new 5 Series is a shade longer and wider, but the addition of an extra 20mm to the wheelbase should mean for extra legroom in the cabin.

The initial range of 5 Series saloons will be limited to a single petrol, engine... the 2.0 litre, four cylinder 520i. It comes with an 8-speed automatic gearbox as standard. Top speed is 142mph; 0-60 comes up in 7.5 seconds. BMW reckon



you'll get a shade over 48mpg which is pretty good going bearing in mind the size and weight of the car. Prices start at £51,000.

The electric and PHEV versions arrive next year.

As for what you get, the trims start off with M Sport. That means the standard kit includes LED front and rear lights, air con, sat nav, sports front seats, heated driver's seat, powered mirrors, rear camera and parking sensors. The interior also features BMW's excellent 12.3-inch screen behind the steering wheel and a 14.9-inch touchscreen infotainment system with Apple CarPlay and Android



Auto. It looks great and works well. To be honest, most folk will be perfectly happy with the entry level trim. You can also add the usual BMW Comfort and Tech packs.

If you want something to make your new 5 Series seem even more special, go for the M Sport Pro trim which gives you bigger alloys, rear spoiler and a natty illuminated front grille.

More powerful models are in the pipeline, but for the moment the new BMW 5 Series is in safe hands. It's moving with the times but also nods to its heritage.

The icon continues



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This is the first car in the Dacia range to arrive in this country with electric assistance...it's the Dacia Jogger Hybrid.

Prices for the 7-seater Jogger Hybrid start at £22,995.

It's a proper 7-seater and, in the case of the Hybrid model in Expression trim, it's well-equipped too.

Under the bonnet there's a 138bhp 1.6 litre petrol engine mated to an automatic gearbox and two self-charging, battery driven electric motors. The Jogger Hybrid feels sharp off the line because it always starts in electric mode. You'll manage 0-60mph in 10 seconds. For those of you who only do a short-ish commute, school run etc, the fact that you can run for about 40 miles on electric power only, will be a major factor in choosing the Dacia Jogger Hybrid version. Use the hybrid system to its full extent and you'll get very close to the official figure of 56.5mpg.

It's surprising that it's taken so long for Dacia to introduce some sort of electrification into their range because they're owned by Renault who've been using it for ages.

In terms of kit, the Expression trim (it's the introductory level on the hybrid model) gets you an 8-inch touchscreen with smartphone compatibility, rear camera, powered windows, keyless entry, parking sensors all-round, LED headlights, roof bars, DAB radio, powered mirrors, air con and cruise control as standard. We wouldn't bother





with the top of the range Extreme trim unless you realty must have heated seats and additional styling.

As we mentioned earlier, this is a proper 7-seater. The third row will cope with a couple of adults (assuming you're not carrying a bunch of rugby players) rather than a pair of the local Hobbits. You can flop the 2nd row of seats forward and remove the 3rd row entirely if you want to use the Jogger as a glorified estate car. You'll end up with a vast 2,085 cubic litre of space. With 7 seats in place you still have a surprising amount of boot space. If you need extra capacity for 7 occupants, you can make use of the roof rails.

It's good to drive too and very quiet. It shrugs off rough and lumpy road surfaces yet manages to avoid too much in terms of body roll. It's not what you'd call fun, but it's fuss free and very comfortable.

Forget about the Dacia Jogger being competitively priced (which it is). It's a terrific 7-seater in its own right.

One thing's for certain, Dacia sales will continue to increase throughout 2023.

MERCEDES AMG GT 63 S E PERFORMANCE Fast-Fulfious

What you're looking at is the first performance hybrid from Mercedes-AMG. It's taken a while to finally come to fruition...it was muted by Mercedes back in 2017.

Let's do some number crunching.

Under the bonnet you'll find a 4.0 litre V8 bi-turbo petrol engine which, when added to the oomph delivered by a battery-powered electric motor on the rear axle, delivers a thumping 832bhp. All of this goes via a 9-speed automatic gearbox mated to a 4MATIC all-wheel drive system.

Floor the throttle and you hurtle to the horizon. 0-60 mph comes up in a truly stunning 2.9 seconds. Top speed is 196mph. For a car approaching 2.3 tonnes, these are impressive figures.

And yes, as this car is a plug-in hybrid, you can drive it using electric power only. However, don't get excited because Mercedes say that it can only manage





a rather pathetic 8 miles. But that's missing the point because the battery and electric motor are there to work in tandem with the engine and provide terrific off-the-line performance. If you make full use of the hybrid system and don't enjoy the engine note and performance, Mercedes reckon you can get around 35mpg. To be honest, you'll be lucky to get high 20's but we suspect you won't be too miffed when you're forking-out around £180,000.

There are seven driving modes which you select from a knob on the steering wheel...Comfort, Electric, Sport, Sport+, Race, Slippery and Individual (allows you to drift the car). To be honest, although it's fun to play with, most folk will leave everything in Comfort and let the air suspension do its work. If you use this car purely for longlegged motorway jaunts, you are in for a wonderful experience because you glide along with only a distant rumble from the engine, but when you need to overtake and boot the accelerator, the car comes alive.

And if you don't want to disturb the neighbours and fancy saving the planet, switch to 'Electric' mode to arrive / depart home in silence.

The interior is a work of art with lashings of leather, chrome and natty lighting. The dashboard and steering wheel have a plethora of ways in which you can configure how the car operates. The 12.3-inch touchscreen and head-up display work well. The sat-nav is one of the best around and provides you with direction sign photos.

Formula One had a big say in the way this Mercedes AMG GT 63 S E Performance produces its power so when Max Verstappen notches-up his next F1 win, we should say thank you.

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WHEN SMALL IS BEAUTIFUL Audi A1 and Audi Q2 show that size doesn't matter

It's very easy to assume that bigger, faster, longer, taller etc etc is better. But is that really the case?

Take the Audi range for example.

Yes, they have some fantastic machinery, all of which are hugely desirable, but for a lot of us it's worth concentrating on the models which appear at the start of the Audi range.

Take the Audi A1 and the Audi Q2 for example.

The 5-door A1 Sportback kicks off at the Audi range. Prices start at £22,710 which, bearing in mind this is a premium car which comes well equipped even in entry level trim, is decent value for money. There's also a really good choice of petrol engines. You can either aim for some serious economy, or you can go for something which is heading down the sporty route.

You can go for a 1.0 litre engine which is available in two states of tuning (95bhp or 110bhp) or a 1.5 litre (150bhp) engine. No matter which one you go for you'll be getting around 50mpg. There's also a choice of manual or automatic gearboxes.

In terms of performance, the 1.5 litre 35 TFSI with an S tronic gearbox hits 60 mph in a shade over 9 seconds. However, go for the introductory engine...the 1.0 litre 25 TFSE with a 5-speed manual gearbox, and you'll still reach 60mph in 11 seconds yet return a predicted 50.4mpg.

As for trim, you can choose from Sport, S Line and Black Edition. All are well equipped, good to drive and will hang onto their value.

If you still fancy something with compact dimensions but would like the versatility of an SUV, then look at the Audi Q2.

You'll find the two larger engines from

the A1 also appear in this Q2. The car was recently given a refresh which made it a tad more sporty and aggressive....it looks great. As with the A1, trim comes in Sport, S Line and Black Edition levels. A 6-speed manual gearbox comes as standard but you can opt for the S tronic auto 'box.

The one thing you notice as soon as you climb on board is that you have a great view of the road thanks to the high driving position. It makes for simple positioning of the car in traffic. Parking is a doddle...parking sensors come as standard by the way. You also get satellite navigation, DAB radio, air con, cruise control, sports seats and a stack of safety kit.

Something else you'll notice in both the Q2 and A1 is that they're deceptively roomy. Looks can be deceiving.

Prices for the Audi Q2 start at £27,135.

So, the Audi A1 and Audi Q2...compact dimensions but big on personality, choice and value.



And the new Volvo EX30 is seriously well-priced too.

One of the big complaints is that electric cars are expensive. Well when this new Volvo EX30 arrives on our shores later this year, the starting price is expected to be in the region of £33,750 which is extremely competitive.

However, all of the other facts and figures are arguably even more impressive.

Depending on which powertrain you go for (there are 3) Volvo's smallest ever SUV comes with the potential for great range and absolutely stunning performance. Go for the top of the range 422bhp Twin Motor Performance all-wheel drive power option and you can hit 60mph in 3.4 seconds which makes it the quickest Volvo....ever. However, even the entry level EX30 develops a very healthy 268bhp which means you can reach 60mph in a shade over 5.0 seconds. That's the beauty of all-electric cars. You have 100 per cent power from the moment you hit the throttle. And it's effortless...no gears, no clutch.

In the middle there's another 268bhp power option but it comes with a bigger battery to allow more range. It'll probably turn out to be the most popular model in the range.

Ah....range. The big question mark for any electric car.

The entry level EX30 will manage 213 miles, but if you go for the same car but with the bigger battery and Volvo reckon you can reach 298 miles.

Rapid charging times for all of the EX30s are around 25 minutes from 10-80 per cent.

Volvo say that you should buy this car purely on your driving style and the sort of mileage you expect to cover. Your choice will be reflected in the price. Fair



enough. Their argument is that there's no need to buy a car which can cover a high mileage when actually you'll only be doing a round commute of 20 miles a day and that you rarely go on a long journey.

There are two equipment grades at launch – Plus and Ultra. An additional Core entry-level grade will be introduced later next year with prices rumoured to

kick off in the region of £32,000.


In terms of kit, Plus specification includes 12.3-inch touchscreen display, two-zone climate control, Harman Kardon premium sound system with dashboard soundbar (there are no speakers in the doors...the soundbar runs along the top of the facia) front and rear parking sensors, rear camera, heated front seats and heated steering wheel.

Additional features on Ultra grade include 360-degree camera, fixed panoramic sunroof, dark-tinted rear windows, a self-parking system, 20-inch alloy wheels, and power-adjustable front seats.

And if you want to impress your friends tell them that a quarter of the aluminium used in your new Volvo EX30 has been recycled, as has 17 per cent of the steel and plastic.

We've yet to drive the EX30 but we went on the launch and saw the car in the flesh and sat in it. The car is extremely smart...looks great (think of a smoothed-off XC40)...and has a seriously premium feel to the interior.

Order books are open now. Form a queue.

The difference between the two power outputs might appear to be significant at first glance, but in truth it doesn't make much difference in day to day motoring and even though the predicted range of the lower power model drops to 262 miles, that will still be ample for the majority of you reading this. I'd save your money and avoid the temptation of the more powerful Born.

This is the first all-electric CUPRA. It's a thoroughly enjoyable and competent car and certainly bodes well for future electric cars from the Spanish manufacturer.

CUPRA, which is the sporting arm of SEAT, has the knack of taking a 'standard' car and bringing it to life.

First of all, the CUPRA Born looks better than the ID.3 because it has a more aggressive appearance and fatter tyres. The ride height has been lowered slightly and the steering made sharper. We think it looks cool

CUPRA Born cuts

Under the skin this is really a Volkswagen ID.3. However,

There are two power options, (a third lower powered version is in the pipeline apparently) both of which feed a single motor which drives the rear wheels. You can select either a 202bhp 58kWh battery or a 240bhp 77kWh battery which gives the CUPRA Born terrific performance and decent range. CUPRA reckon you'll get 340 miles before running out of juice with the bigger battery. If you can find one of the increasing number of rapid chargers, you'll hit an 80 per cent charge in around half an hour. You can also manage a 0-60mph time of around 6.6 seconds.

You can tell that the suspension has been lowered because the ride can feel a tad firm at slower speeds, but get moving on the quicker stuff and the payoff is that the CUPRA Born handles really well. It's not quite in hot hatch territory but it's not far off.

Trim names can often be a bit confusing with various manufacturers, but CUPRA has gone to the other extreme with the Born. You have three versions to choose from....V1, V2 and, erm, oh yes, V3. The cheapest Born kicks off at £36,475. Fancy the more powerful one?...add £5500.

Every Born comes with a handsome 12-inch touch screen and a 5.3-inch instrument cluster. The sat nav is responsive but the even though the temperature can be adjusted by external buttons, doing anything else is a bit fiddly, which is not ideal when you're on the move. There's also a rear view camera.

The seats are supportive but comfy and there's plenty of room for adults in the rear. There's a sense of quality about the interior trims too.

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MUSSO

The weather. I don't know about where you live, but summer 2023 has yet to materialise. We've had so much rain that I'm developing webbed feet.

Last week though, the planets were aligned. I was heading to the Lake District and my test car was the brand new SsangYong Musso Saracen +.

Oh and the + isn't a typing error...it means this particular Musso is a long wheelbase version.

Early models were a tad agricultural but SsangYong has moved with the times and their vehicles are now very much 21st Century. In fact, if you go for the Saracen model shown here, the interior is downright plush and puts a lot of much more expensive vehicles to shame.

Let's start with some basic figures.

Prices start at £24,765 ex VAT or £30,093 if you're not VAT registered. The fact that SsangYong quotes ex VAT shows that the Musso is aimed very much at owners who intend using their Musso as a workhorse. However, pickups are also very much a style statement these days and a lot of Mussos will find homes in leafy suburbs and experience nothing trickier than a school shuttle, supermarket run or holiday outing to the beach.

The Musso is a 'double-cab' which means you get four doors and five seats. Go for the 6-speed automatic version rather than the manual (the Saracen + has auto





as standard) and you'll be able to tow 3.5 tonnes and carry just over 1.1 tonnes in the load bed area at the same time. No other pick-up available in the UK can match those figures. The new 204 bhp 2.2 litre diesel turbo has incredible strength and flexibility. 0-60mph comes up in just over 11 seconds. Top speed is 114mph.

Four trim levels are available...EX, Rebel, Saracen and Saracen +. Go for top of the range Saracen + and you'll get satellite navigation, climate control, rear view camera, DAB radio, front and rear parking sensors, leather upholstery, heated and ventilated front seats, 18-inch alloys and a stack of safety kit.

Despite its size, the Musso is good to drive. The square front and rear dimensions make it easy to place on the road. The interior is roomy and comfortable. Kids love riding in a pick-up truck.

This excellent SsangYong pick-up has the knack of being able to deliver a pallet of bricks on the morning, haul a hefty trailer in the afternoon and then take you and your friends to a restaurant in the evening.

Surprising SsangYong? You bet.

York found to offer the best combination of accessibility, public charging options and electric car-friendly accommodation.

Vauxhall has been doing some research. They reckon they've found the best winter breaks for anyone in the UK who owns or uses an electric car... and it's great to see that one is on our doorstep...York.

They used the highly regarded Condé Nast Traveller research to find the 10 best winter getaways in Britain, comparing how many locations could be reached from the country's 15 most populous cities using the 209-mile range of something like their Vauxhall Mokka Electric.

The research took into account the number of public charging points within a 10-mile radius in each city, how many of them were rapid chargers with speeds in excess of 50kW, as well as the number of accommodation options which offered charging for electric car drivers.

York is within reach from 11 of the most populous cities in the UK using the 209-mile range of the Mokka Electric, so it's a piece of cake from the North East. They say that York has 47 different public charging points, with 11 of them featuring rapid charging. York also has the highest number of accommodation options which offer charging for electric vehicles, with 21 different choices within 10 miles of the city centre.

Tied in second place are Lode in Cambridgeshire and Bath in Somerset. The Winter Garden in Lode has been designed with plants that thrive in the winter months, with the village within 209 miles of 12 of the most populous cities in the country. Visitors there have access to 36 public charging stations.

Drivers heading to Bath to enjoy the Roman ruins and bath houses, or to visit the thermal spas on a cold day, will have access to 28 charging points within a 10mile radius of the city centre, of which four come with speeds above 50kW. The city is also within 209 miles from

10 of Britain's most populous cities. Bath also has 16 accommodation options

offering charging for electric drivers within a 10-mile distance from the city centre.

The remaining top 5 locations based on Vauxhall's research are: Woodstock in The

Cotswolds, Newquay in Cornwall, and Beaulieu in New Forest.

Bear in mind however, that in winter weather the electric car range will decrease due to colder weather.

We'd like to chuck the Lake District into the mix. Okay, no big cities, not many chargers, not many people during the winter, decent prices...but if you do a bit of planning, it's another great place to visit from our region.

And we can't believe that Edinburgh isn't on the list. Ah well....damned lies and statistics.



Portugal offers the longest drive, taking 18 hours and 26 minutes to reach from the Channel Tunnel. Something the research points out is that you need to keep an eye on the weather. Short spells of hot and thundery weather regularly happen on the Continent and, yes, it gets hot. Sometimes, as we've seen this year, it becomes absolutely scorching.

Bright sunshine and high temperatures pose a challenge when driving, and with schools on holiday and more people on the road, drivers also need to navigate busier traffic during the day. There's also more pollen about... beware hay fever sufferers.

Oh...and buy a decent pair of sunglasses. They're worth it and reduce glare.

And don't forget to take a break. Have fun.

The motoring landscape is changing as we drift towards electrification, but some manufacturers are already ahead of the game.

Like Lexus for example.

They've been involved in battery power since 2005 when they launched their first hybrid. The hybrid technology was so good that it enabled sizeable cars like the RX to achieve excellent mpg figures. The other advantage of hybrid power is that if you need some extra oomph, the battery powered electric motors can join the party.

You end up with a double whammy.... good economy and good performance.

However, Lexus have now gone the whole hog and introduced plug-in hybrids (PHEVs) and also fully electric powered cars.

And here are two of the best.

The RX and NX...both available with plug-in hybrid technology.

The beauty of PHEV plug-in hybrids is that you can charge the Lexus RX 450h and NX450h at home or at work and enjoy your daily commute without using any petrol. The RX in full electric mode will cover 43 miles. Lexus reckon you can crack the 200mpg barrier if you use the hybrid technology to its full extent and rarely use the 2.5 litre petrol engine. Okay, that figure is highly unlikely in real-world motoring, but it still means the RX will return decent economy while still being able to cover the 0-60 dash in 6.5 seconds. You can charge the battery from empty to full in around 3 hours using a typical domestic wallbox.

The Lexus RX range kicks off at $\pm 62,125...$ but you can slice around $\pm 17k$ off that total if you go for the Lexus NX. To be honest, the main difference between the RX and the NX is the size. The

NX is the smaller stablemate but just everything else is the same....top quality build, comfortable, good levels of safety equipment, burst proof reliability...

in fact, it's so good that What Car? magazine named the Lexus NX450h PHEV as their Best Plug-In Hybrid and it was named mid-size Premium SUV of the Year in the Auto Express New Car Awards for a second year in succession.

The electric-only range of 45 miles will cope with most daily commutes, but of

course the big advantage of the PHEV Lexus NX and RX is that you never have to worry about range anxiety. If you run out of battery power, the 2.5 litre petrol engine will keep you moving. The combined power of the engine and the electric motor comes to 306bhp which gives you a brisk 0-60 time of 6.3 seconds. You can also travel at up to 83mph on battery power only.

Sat nav, DAB radio, reversing camera, heated steering wheel, LED headlights, leather upholstery, powered and heated front seats, powered hatch and a cracking audio system all come as standard.

They've got the X factor.

THERE'S AN ELECTREASEN FUTURE AT NISSAN

Nissan give you some electric options

As you probably know, January 1st 2030 will mean you can no longer buy a car powered solely by petrol or diesel. Some hybrids get a stay of execution until 2035.

So, Nissan has anticipated this by launching new models and updating others to give you plenty of power options.

And the good news is that Lookers Nissan will always have a selection that you can take for a test drive and see which one suits your needs and driving style.

Every model in the Nissan range now features some sort of electrification...the Ariya and the Nissan LEAF are currently their 100% electric models, but more are in the pipeline.



The Nissan Ariya is a super-stylish, all-electric large SUV which is similar in size to the popular X-Trail...more about that one shortly. It's been getting rave reviews. Auto Express gave the Ariya their Car of the Year gong.

Quite right too. We tested one a few weeks ago and it marks a hint of the future for Nissan. It looks fabulous and there's a premium feel to the interior. Depending on which model you go for you can get up to 329 miles on a single charge. If you need a top-up, the Ariya will add a further 217 miles in about 30 minutes via a rapid charger. There's even an all-wheel drive model.

Prices start at £46,145 which is very competitive bearing in mind the size and high level of standard specification.

The X-Trail (from £32,890) we mentioned earlier is aimed at anyone who fancies a bit of an adventure. Two versions are available but both have the same 1.5 litre petrol engine under the bonnet. The hybrid version has an electric motor which helps the engine, but you can also go for e-Power which is where an electric motor drives the wheels while the engine operates as a generator. We loved the e-Power X Trail because it drives much like an electric car...but you need never worry about battery range because the engine will keep the battery on song. You can even opt for the all-wheel drive model which has an additional electric motor driving the rear wheels.

Elsewhere in the Nissan range, the recently updated Qashqai and Juke now have hybrid power. It's also great to report that the Sunderland-built Qashqai was recently named Britain's most reliable car by the Which? consumer group. Praise indeed.

And finally, there's the car which really started the electric revolution in this country...the Nissan LEAF. With prices starting at £28,495 it is still one the most attractive electric buys in the UK.

THE RENAULUTION IS UNDERWAY

Flurry of new models cross the Channel

One of the main goals of Renault's strategic plan... they call it the Renaulution...is to introduce models which will steadily replace petrol and diesel driven versions of the same or similar cars in their range.

This is to prepare for 2030 when the UK Government...and a lot of others around Europe...force the sale of new normally aspirated cars to end.

Consequently, Renault is providing options....all electric or the halfway house of choosing a hybrid which will sort of prepare you for the full switch.

So, let's look at your potential choices.

One of the best...and latest...is the Renault Austral which, in effect, replaces the Kadjar. It is only available with hybrid power. There's a 1.2 litre petrol engine under the bonnet and a selfcharging battery-driven electric motor which, when added together gives you an output of 198bhp. Renault reckon you'll crack 60mpg, but of course if you can use the hybrid system to its

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full extent...you can trundle around town using only battery power. In fact, Renault reckon the Austral SUV is likely to spend around 80 per cent of its time in slow traffic.

Three versions are on offer...Techno, Techno Esprit Alpine and Iconic Esprit Alpine. Prices start at £34,695. There's a quality feel to the interior and you get plenty of kit as standard. The 12.3-inch digital dash, 12-inch touchscreen and head-up display are terrific.

If you fancy a smaller SUV, check out the Renault Arkana. Again, you get full hybrid power with a 1.6 litre petrol engine and battery-driven electric motor developing 143bhp which will also get you close to 60mpg and let you manage 0-60mph in a shade over 10 seconds.

Prices start at £28,395 which is seriously competitive.

One of our favourite cars in the entire Renault range is the all-electric Megane. It looks great and is terrific to drive. You can manage close to 300 miles on a full charge. The 215bhp electric motor which drives the front wheels, gives you good





performance. Make use of the power and your range will drop, but the 0-60 time of 7.5 seconds is very tempting!

It's well equipped and extremely comfortable, and rates as one of our favourite all-electric cars.

Elsewhere, the Renault range delivers. Captur, Clio and Zoe continue to be hugely popular...and if you like the look of the new Austral but would fancy an even larger SUV, then hang on because the all new Renault Rafale is in the pipeline.

The Renaulution is well and truly underway.

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

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HYDROGEN. IS IT THE FUTURE FOR CARS?

As the race continues for all cars to be battery powered, is hydrogen an alternative?

We're sure that you're getting bored of hearing this, but January 1st 2030 signifies the death of conventional petrol and diesel new car sales. The UK Government...along with loads of other countries...is forcing us to buy electric. Some hybrids get a stay of execution until 2035.

All of which means that you may as well get used to planning ahead to make sure you have sufficient charge in the car's battery to reach your destination or reach a charging station. If you are travelling a long distance, you will have to build in additional time to complete your journey for the simple reason that you'll be stopping to recharge the battery.

But wouldn't it be handy if we could simply call into the equivalent of a petrol station, fill the tank, and resume our journey, just like the majority of folk still do in the world of cars.

There is a solution. It's called hydrogen.

And the good news is that although

we've seen car manufacturers dabble with hydrogen power, there now seems to be a bit of impetus building in making this new technology suitable for the mass-market.

Toyota and Hyundai have previously been involved in building a tiny number of hydrogen cars, (the Toyota Mirai and Hyundai Nexo) but BMW is now flexing its muscles and dipping a toe into the idea of hydrogen power.

They've launched a fleet of around 100 BMW iX5 Hydrogen cars which will be employed for demonstration and trial purposes for various target groups.

The key thing to point out here is that hydrogen doesn't actually power the car like petrol or diesel. To keep things simple and without delving into chemistry, the best way to think of this is that hydrogen flows from a tank, mixes with oxygen taken from the outside air and hits a series of fuel cells which convert the gases into electricity. The electricity then either powers the car's electric motor directly or goes into a



battery. Power then transfers from the battery to the motor.

The only emissions will be water vapour from the 'exhaust' pipe.

BMW reckon it'll take only 3-4 minutes to fill the hydrogen tank. The iX5 Hydrogen model you see here has a range of 313 miles, can hit 60mph in 6 seconds and go on to 112mph. Power equates to around 400bhp.

So, the technology is being developed.... we'll need to see more hydrogen filling stations (there are currently only 16 across the UK)...but it's encouraging to read that at least there is an alternative to electric power as we know it. Time will tell if the motoring world goes for it.

Power comes from 1.5-litre, turbocharged petrol engine with a manual gearbox although you can opt for an auto 'box.

Elsewhere in the range, if you are ultracost conscious, go for the MG3 (from £13,820)...if you fancy a compact electric SUV then you'll love the MG ZS EV (from 30,495)...or how about an all-electric estate with the MG5 EV (from £30,995).

One thing is certain, with the MG4 collecting a haul of awards so far this year, you can bet that the company will have some more in their trophy cabinet by the end of the year.

Something for everyone at Ford

The beauty of being a company as large as Ford is that they can have one of the largest ranges of any manufacturer. It continues to evolve so it really is a case of keeping up with the changes.

One of the latest new vehicles to break cover is the new Ford Ranger which rates as Europe's best-selling pick-up. It's also finding a whole new market of buyers because the Ranger is so refined that it is now seen as an alternative 'lifestyle' vehicle. In other words, ditch the car and use a Ranger pick-up.

The 3.0 litre Raptor is typical of Ford's sporting heritage. Another example is the Ford Puma ST.

The Puma ST takes a load of its oily bits from the Fiesta ST which rates as one of the best hot hatches around.

Some of you will remember that the Ford Puma used to be a funky coupé, but now it's a small SUV. We love it. It looks good, drives really well, is quick when you go for the ST, yet works perfectly as a family holdall.

Power in the ST comes from a 1.5 litre petrol engine which drives the front wheels via a 6-speed manual 'box. The suspension has been beefed-up when compared to other Pumas, the steering is sharp and the anti-roll bars have been tweaked. Despite being quite a lofty car, it feels really well grounded. Fun too.

And with prices starting at £31,070 we think it's a bit of a bargain.

The entry level S-Cross comes with a 1.4 litre mild hybrid engine which drives the front wheels through a 6-speed manual gearbox. The battery-driven electric motor gives the engine some added oomph. 0-60 takes a shade over 9 seconds. Economy is an impressive 53.2mpg. There's even an option to go for ALL-GRIP all-wheel drive which gets an auto 'box. This only bumps-up



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the price by around £4800...it's worth looking at if you live out in the sticks.

The 1.5 litre full hybrid gets an automatic gearbox and slightly improved fuel economy.

In terms of equipment, every Suzuki

S-Cross is well equipped. Suzuki keeps things nice and simple with just two levels of trim...Motion and Ultra...but even Motion gives you a reversing camera, front and rear parking sensors, air con, powered windows all-round, powered / folding mirrors, heated front seats, DAB radio, roof rails and a smart touchscreen with Android Auto and Apple CarPlay. Not much else you need really.

Prices for the Suzuki S-Cross start at £26,099...and if you're reading this before the end of September 2023 you get two years free servicing.

Go and have a test drive. You'll discover why Suzuki has one of the highest levels of customer retention. Once you've got one...you love them.

TOYOTA PLAYS THE NUMBERS GAME... AND WINS.

The GR86 is a firecracker of a car.

The Toyota GR86 takes over from the GT86. The difference is the subtle alteration to the name. The GR initials are significant because this means the car has been sorted by Gazoo Racing. They're hugely successful in the World Rally Championship.... they're the reigning champions.

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It's also interesting that Toyota wants to maintain some serious fun factor in these GR cars, which explains why you'll find a manual gearbox. An auto is available but you'd be strongly recommended to stick with a stick.

Toyota has gone down the route of building of what could easily be called a simple, old-school, front engine - rear wheel drive sports car. There's even a manual handbrake which is great for locking the rear wheels on a snowy road and letting you do a handbrake turn into your driveway.

When compared to the Toyota GT86, the GR86 has seen more power teased from the engine which climbs from 2.0 litres to 2.4 litres and shaves a second off the 0-60 time which now sits at 6.3 seconds. It's much more relaxing to drive than its predecessor. Economy will be in the region of mid 30s mpg.

The sound the engine makes is one of the great characteristics of this car because it's a Subaru boxer engine. It's very distinctive.

The GR86 looks better than the GT86. The problem with the GT version was that the tyres looked skinny. Well, thankfully, Toyota has fixed that and now provides 18-inch boots. They fill the wheel arches....it makes the car look more purposeful.

The driving thrill is spot on. The steering is perfectly weighted....the 6-speed gearbox has a lovely action {which is handy because you'll be using it a lot), you have a low-slung centre of gravity which makes the car feel rock-solid on the road.

The interior is a typical sports car 2+2 layout. The front seats are supportive and comfy while the rear seats are really only handy for chucking coats or some soft overnight bags.

In terms of kit, you get loads of safety gadgets plus the vital stuff like sat nav, climate control, reversing camera and parking sensors.

There's no doubting that the Toyota GR86 is one of the finest driving cars ever built. It's wonderful.

This could be the car which makes you want to get up on a Sunday morning and just go out for a drive for the Hell of it. The Toyota GR86 really is that good. It's a future classic.

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
