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#### Polestars three models aren't your normal electric cars.

It's the headline which grabs everyone because the Polestar 4 doesn't have a rear window, but look beyond that and, as with the rest of the Polestar range, you have a car which is great to drive, looks good and has one of the best ranges around.

In the Polestar 4, you rely on wing mirrors and a high-definition, roof mounted camera which produces an image on the interior driver's 'mirror'.

The designers say it improves aerodynamics, increases rear headroom and allows the glass roof to stretch even further and therefore make the interior light and airy.

It's a different driving experience so you need an extended test drive to see if you can live with it. We did...and yes, you do get used to having an image on a rearview mirror.


The Polestar 4 is bigger than the Polestar 2 but slightly smaller than the SUV-focussed Polestar 3. The company refer to it as a performance coupé SUV.

Two versions are available...long range single motor and long range dual motor. The single motor (268bhp, 0-60mph in 6.9 seconds, range 385 miles) feeds the rear wheels, while the dual motor (536bhp. 0-60mph 3.7 seconds, range 367 miles) gives you all-wheel drive. Both models have a top speed of 124mph.

You get a 10-80 per cent charge on a rapid charger in around 30 minutes. Great car.

If you're thinking of going 100% electric, the Polestar 2 is an ideal place to start.

As with the other Polestars, you get various levels of power and performance. There's even a Performance Pack model. We like the dual motor, all-wheel drive



Polestar 2 which develops 416 bhp and hits 60 mph from standstill in 4.3 seconds. Range is 369 miles.

We managed a round trip of 320 miles before needing to stop for two reasons. 1, the car needed charging...and 2, we needed a 'comfort' break.

And what about the Polestar 3? It a seriously smart SUV...low and sleek... and is wonderful to drive. The interior is a work of art...it's roomy and seats

five with ease. A large proportion of the interior is made from recycled materials. Safety and driver assistance are high on the agenda with every Polestar, which comes as no surprise as it comes from the Swedish Volvo family. It's also got a very high level of kit as standard.

Again, there's a choice of powertrains, and the all-important range is terrific. Stick with the single-motor, rear-wheel drive version and you'll get an estimated 438 miles. Wow.

Polestar...full of surprises...all of them good.

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## NEW VAUXHALL'S COME THICK AND FAST

Brand new Frontera and Grandland, and updates for Corsa and Mokka keep Vauxhall range looking fresh.

Everyone knows (hopefully) that the future for cars is electric... whether we like it or not.

Vauxhall has been one of the leaders in this field and now offers an electric variant of every car and van in its line-up. The company is the UK's best-selling electric light commercial vehicle manufacturer and, when it comes to their cars, the Corsa Electric is the UK's best-selling electric supermini.

But what about the brand-new cars.







Let's start with the new Vauxhall Frontera which prices both its petrol hybrid and electric models exactly the same, kicking off at £23,995. The company keeps things simple when it comes to choices. There are two trims.. Design and GS. There's a pair of three-cylinder 1.2 litre hybrid petrol engines developing either 99bhp (predicted economy of 53.3mpg and a 0-60mph time of 11 seconds) or 136bhp (0-60 in 9 seconds and similar economy). The electric Frontera gives you a 111bhp output and a range of 186 miles. A bigger battery is on the way...you'll get 248 miles

It's all down to how much you want to pay and what sort of performance you'd like. We'd go for the 136bhp hybrid engine and cough-up the additional £1500. Every model is nicely equipped, rides well and is good to drive.

If you fancy electric motoring, we'd point you in the direction of the brandnew Vauxhall Grandland. How does



425 miles sound from a single charge? Impressive. If you prefer to have an engine under the bonnet, no problem because there's also a 140bhp 1.2 litre petrol hybrid model with predicted economy of over 51mpg. Bearing in mind that this is quite a large car, that's a terrific figure.

The Corsa and Mokka have been a huge success for Vauxhall. The Corsa is the UK's best-selling small car and continues to collect awards like confetti. The Mokka, which is based on the Corsa, is also noted for its reliability having achieved a high score at the JD Power Awards. It was also named as Top Gear's Design of the Year.

Both models have something for everyone in terms of power...petrol, petrol hybrid and electric...pick the one which suits your lifestyle.

You could say the same for the entire Vauxhall range of cars and vans...there's something in there which will tick your boxes.

The only snag is keeping up with all of the developments. A nice problem to have!

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#### The gongs just keep on coming.

Hyundai is going to need a bigger trophy cabinet. 2025 has seen the company continue to collect a staggering number of awards for their cars.

Here's a quick list....

IONIQ 5 N has been given the prestigious 5-Star award by Autocar. They called the hot hatch a 'game changer' and 'blindingly good fun.'

The all-new SANTA FE was named as Best 7-Seater at the Autotrader annual awards. IONIQ 5 was named Best Car for City Drivers. The awards are decided by real-world feedback from more than 225,000 UK car owners.

The IONIQ 6 was named Best EV Executive Car at the Great British Fleet Awards. Bearing in mind that fleet bosses are difficult to please...they want

cars that drivers like...comfy, economical, good value, well equipped and reliable.

TopGear.com staged their annual Electric Awards...and no surprise that the Hyundai IONIQ 9 was named Best EV 7-Seater.

If you had to pick one seriously impressive award, it was for the brandnew Hyundai INSTER which has been named 2025 World Electric Vehicle. The awards, which are decided by 96 of the world's leading motoring journalists... are something at which Hyundai are becoming experts having had previous success with IONIQ 5 N winning the 2024 World Performance Car title, and IONIQ 5 and IONIQ 6 achieving victories in 2022 and 2023, respectively. Impressive huh?

The INSTER, which is the latest car to arrive at Hyundai dealers, was also named as What Car?'s Best Small Electric Car for the City. It's the brand's first small EV for the European market, and blends robust, but compact SUV styling with effortless urban driving and strong performance on longer drives...

At the moment there are two INSTER models available, kicking off with



INSTER 01 which has a 42kWh battery developing 97bhp and a potential range of 203 miles. If you want additional power and extra mileage, go for the INSTER 02 49kWh which ups the ante to 115bhp and 229 miles. There's roughly three grand between the two, but the INSTER 02 gets additional kit as well. It's the version we'd go for...it'll hold onto its value and slightly reduces any range anxiety. It's 0-60mph sprint of 10.6 seconds will be fine, bearing in mind that this is a car designed largely for city use. Having said that, it'll keep pace with motorway traffic without too much fuss. A 10-80 per cent charge takes about half an hour

It's a good-looking thing. We went on the launch and were surprised by how roomy it was. The rear seats slides back in the 02 version...okay it reduces the boot space but legroom is impressive. Comfy too. As for kit...let's just say you get the stuff that you really need.

The INSTER is typical Hyundai. They're a leader when it comes to electric cars. They're winners.

Available with both hybrid and plug-in hybrid powertrains, the Captur balances performance and efficiency, making it a strong competitor in the urban crossover segment. If you need something slightly larger, go for the Symbioz model.

In the electric segment, Renault have the 5 and recently launched 4. If you need a bit more interior space, go for the Renault 4. We like the Renault Mégane E-Tech...a fully electric hatchback that boasts futuristic design, advanced infotainment, and over 280 miles of range making it suitable for both city and long-distance driving. If you want a handsome super-stylish car, look no further. It's gorgeous.

Renault also caters to commercial users with its Kangoo and Trafic vans, available





in both diesel and electric versions. These models are particularly popular among businesses looking for efficient urban delivery solutions.

With the UK car market rapidly moving toward electrification, Renault has positioned itself well through its E-Tech technology and broad electric offering. The brand combines French flair with practical features and a strong emphasis on value, making it a solid choice for UK drivers. As regulations tighten and consumer preferences shift, Renault's adaptable range will continue to tick the right boxes for the UK motoring public.



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## CITROËN C THE WAY AHEAD

## The C3, ë-C3 and C3 Aircross are three of the most important cars for Citroën.

They're not only the company's biggest sellers, they also introduce a lot of buyers to the Citroën range in the first place and, as Citroën would hope, can lead them to buy bigger (and more profitable) models in the future.

So, when it was decided to launch a 4th generation C3 and C3 Aircross, that will have been a big decision for the French manufacturer. Get it wrong and it'll be a major hit.

Well, the good news is that they've got it spot on. The cars are well priced, versatile, nicely equipped and decent to drive.

We think it's a good-looking car. The C3 has a hint of SUV styling about it, even though it's best described as a versatile hatchback, but the designers have cleverly moved the styling forwards. It still looks like a Citroen C3.

The latest C3 comes with various powertrains...petrol, hybrid and ell-electric ë-C3. The hybrid is probably a good bet if you do a fair amount of urban driving but also need additional power for some motorway work. Citroen reckon most buyers will use battery power alone for 50 per cent of urban journeys.



The C3 range kicks off with a petrol-only 1.2 litre unit which develops 99bhp (0-60mph in 10.6 seconds and a predicted 52mpg figure). Everything goes via a 6-speed manual gearbox.

The hybrid model sees the engine joined by an electric, battery powered motor. Add both power outputs together and you'll end up with around 110bhp. It slices a second off the 0-60 sprint. Top speed is the same at 99mph. The gearbox is now a 6-speed auto. Economy improves to just under 60mpg,



but if you use the hybrid system and drive on battery power alone, that figure will climb.

If you fancy all-electric motoring, the ë-C3 is worth a serious look. The 112bhp motor can use a rapid charger and will boost the battery from 20%-80% in around 26 minutes. Predicated range is a shade under 200 miles which, for most folk using this size of car, will be perfect.

If you want a car which stands out even more than the C3 and ë-C3, head for the Aircross version. You have the same powertrain options as the C3, but you can also go for a 7-seat version. Okay, the third row will be for kids, but it's a handy option to have. As SUVs go, this is one of the most versatile on the market.

No matter which model you go for, they offer outstanding comfort, great levels of equipment and a seriously affordable price. It can't fail.





## I LOVE MY CAR.

## Catherine goes full circle in her Renault 5.

When Catherine first started working as a teacher, she needed a car. The car she loved at the time was the one she bought.

A Renault 5 Campus.

Catherine has recently retired so we'll let you guess how long ago that was.

She's also decided that the time is right to buy a brand-new car. Catherine is a convert to electric power... in fact she and her husband have had four different electric cars. No surprise that they have a home charger.

Catherine has now gone full circle because she's just bought the latest Renault 5 which is rapidly establishing itself as one of the most popular small, 100 per cent battery powered cars in the UK.

"Two things made me want to change my car," said Catherine. "My previous electric car was great, but the big problem was the range...it wasn't suitable for the sort of distances I do.

Volvo EX30 – performance or economy? It's nice to have a choice. And of course it's incredibly safe.

But the one you see here is no ordinary

At the entry-level you can opt for a single motor EX30 which powers the time of 5.7 seconds. Estimated range is 209 miles. There's an option for an extended range model which adds around 90 miles to the estimated range, but we'd recommend that you try and dig deep and go for the Twin Motor Performance model.

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

Leapmotor is still a new name to a lot of the car buying public and as is the case with a lot of new things, we can be a tad unsure about everything...will it be reliable...what's the build quality like...is it safe...am I getting value for money?

These are very sensible questions but, fear not because behind Leapmotor is Stellantis, the powerhouse behind Vauxhall, Fiat, Alfa Romeo, Jeep, Maserati, Citroen and DS. You can buy with confidence.



They've also got a really exciting addition to their range coming up shortly.

Quick reminder of what they already offer. The TO3 city car and family-sized C10 SUV both arrived when the company launched in the UK earlier this year. Top of their priority in terms of publicity was the price.

When using the LEAP-GRANT, the T03 kicks off at £14,495 (a saving of £1500) while the C10, which is bigger and fully loaded, now comes in at £32,760 thanks to the LEAP-GRANT of £3750.

The compact T03 is loaded with goodies like a smart central 10.3-inch touchscreen, digital driver display, DAB radio, sat nav, panoramic sunroof, powered and heated mirrors and smart alloys. You also get a host of safety features. There's a range of 165 miles and a charging time from 30-80 per cent of 38 minutes.

The C10 is bigger in every sense of the



word, and that includes a bigger battery which ups the range to 262 miles, slices the charging rate to about half an hour, and gives you a lively 0-60 time of 7.5 seconds. As with the TO3, standard equipment levels are good.


Waiting in the wings is the B10. It's a compact SUV which will also be available with an extended range pack.

The B10, tipped to cost around £30k, will mirror the rest of the Leapmotor range by having a terrific level of standard kit. 0-60mph is around 6.8 seconds, range is 260 miles and a 30%-80% charge is about 20 minutes. Impressive.

Leapmotor could be the EV manufacturer which makes you finally go for battery power.

## In the case of the Stellantis motor group....a lot.

Brand loyalty. It's something that car manufacturers crave more than anything else. If they can get a customer into one of their smaller models, there's a good chance that person will stick with the brand as, in subsequent years, they can either afford something bigger (not arguably better) or are forced to get some additional interior space and carrying capacity to cater for a growing family. Manufacturers and dealers will bend over backwards to keep you happy and retain your brand loyalty.

The only snag is that nowadays the badge on the bonnet is rarely something unique. You're probably thinking that Rolls Royce is still a standalone company. Nope... they're part of BMW, who also owns MINI.

What about Bentley?...sorry...they're part of the Volkswagen Group which also have SKODA, SEAT, Cupra, Audi, Lamborghini and Porsche.

Aston Martin?...nope...they're owned by a consortium which includes Mercedes and Geely who, incidentally, also own Volvo, Polestar, Lotus etc.

And then there's Stellantis. Who exactly are Stellantis? The company was formed in 2021 when Fiat Chrysler Automobiles

merged with the PSA Group. They're based in Amsterdam. Here's a list of the brands which come under their

As you'll have guessed, not all of those brands are available here in the UK, but rumours abound that Lancia and Chrysler are going to give it another go. Opel is the name used on the continent for Vauxhall.

A phrase you'll often hear and read about is manufacturers using bits and pieces of varying size from a 'parts bin.' In other words, a lot of cars might look different externally, but underneath, you'll find some very familiar kit from the 'parts bin.'

Fancy a Vauxhall Corsa? You may as well look at a couple of other cars because the Corsa shares its engines and platform with various models in the Stellantis group, most notably the Peugeot 208 and Citroen C3. This shared engineering includes 1.2-litre petrol engines, mild-hybrid versions, and all-electric powertrains,



You'd think that a manufacturer like Jeep would use very specialised parts... but no. For example, the Jeep Renegade uses the same platform as the Fiat 500X, while the Jeep Avenger shares powertrains and platforms with Peugeot and Vauxhall vehicles.

One of the platforms that Stellantis uses is called the STLA Medium platform. This underpins current and upcoming models including the Peugeot e-3008, Peugeot e-5008, and the new Vauxhall Grandland. It will also be used for future models such as the Jeep Compass, DS Automobiles No.8, and the upcoming Lancia Gamma and Alfa Romeo Giulietta.

Leapmotor is the exception. Stellantis doesn't currently provide them with anything other than a dealer network and UK support.

If we had to pick one piece of equipment which is used more extensively than anything else, we'd probably guess at the 1.2-litre 3-cylinder PureTech petrol engine. It's a cracking engine...loads of power, economical....it even sounds good and will rev forever. Reliable too. You'll find it in various models from brands including Peugeot, Vauxhall, Citroën, and Jeep.

All of this makes sense because it helps reduce costs. If you step from one



Stellantis brand into another, you can easily spot similar fittings like switchgear or central touchscreen. Producing custom-made articles is expensive but applying a different label or a different knob, can easily disguise things.

And it's not just cars which use this sharing principle. The Vauxhall Vivaro, Peugeot Expert, and Citroën Dispatch share the same Stellantis platform.

So...is the sharing of parts and technology a bad thing?

We don't think so because, let's face it, most people buy a car because it suits their personal taste and, yes, because they were pleased with the model they had previously from that dealer or manufacturer. It also allows manufacturers to keep their models bang up to date because if, for example, Alfa Romeo come up with a good idea, there's no reason why it can't be shared across the rest of the Stellantis group.

The manufacturers also make their cars feel different when you drive them by using different suspension settings or making the steering, brakes and throttle more sensitive and responsive.

But the bottom line is this. If parts sharing across Stellantis means their cars are more reliable, more competitively priced and, yes, more desirable...brilliant. It gets our vote.

Oh, and if you want a car which is built in the UK by a wholly owned British company, go and buy a Morgan.





OMODA PLAYS THE NUMBERS GAME

#### The OMODA 5 is joined by the OMODA 9

It's a year since OMODA arrived in the UK...and they're already proving to be hugely popular.

They're also winners...at the recent Autotrader Drivers' Choice Awards, the OMODA 5 SUV was named 'Best Value New Car'. Quite a coup.

The comment from Autotrader was ...'It's not hard to see why the OMODA 5 is winning over buyers looking for the best 'bang for their buck'. As well as some fantastic top-level features offered as standard, along with a very generous warranty, at such a reasonable price, we can understand why it got such rave reviews.'

Two OMODA 5 models are currently available in the UK. You can choose from petrol power or 100 per cent battery power. A PHEV is due towards the end of the year.

The entry level OMODA 5 is available with a 187 bhp 1.6-litre turbocharged four-cylinder petrol engine. Power goes to the front wheels via a 7-speed automatic 'box. Performance is decent with 0-60mph coming up in 7.7 seconds. OMODA reckons you'll get around 34mpg.

You can also opt for the fully electric OMODA E5 equipped with a 61kWh battery and a 204bhp electric motor, offering 257 miles of emission-free electric range. A 30 to 80% top-up is



possible in just 28 minutes. 0-60mph comes up in 7.2 seconds.

All models have a seven-year / 100,000-mile warranty and seven-year service price cap, which is complemented by seven years of RAC roadside assistance that is automatically renewed with each service at any local OMODA dealership.

If you want something larger, take a look at the handsome OMODA 9 which has recently gone on sale. It's a plug-in hybrid electric vehicle (PHEV) and can offer 93 miles of pure electric range before the 1.5 litre petrol engine joins the party. Use the hybrid and engine set-up to its full extent and you'll manage a whopping 700 miles. 0-60 mph is a rapid 4.9 seconds thanks to a combined output of 443bhp.

There's new black Nappa leather seats and a revised dash panel. The roof and pillars feature black lining, while cabin panels have been revised to a matt black and metal-like finish.

Technical revisions include rear suspension set-up changes to enhance comfort and stability. The rear spring settings have been softened, and the shock absorbers have been adjusted to improve overall handling and comfort balance. The Mazda CX-60 has always been an enjoyable car to drive...it's now

Get ready for the Mazda6e. It's a sleek and super-stylish battery powered fivedoor hatchback and will be available with two powertrain options with a choice of 68.8kWh or 80kWh battery. It won't be here until the start of next year, but excitement is building for what is a

The Mazda range has something for everyone. The MX-5 offers soft or hardtop sporty 2-seater motoring. It's deservedly referred to as an icon.

Want a compact saloon car?...go for the Mazda3...also available as a hatchback.

Prefer the style and versatility of an SUV. We've already mentioned the hugely popular CX-5 and CX-60, but something slightly smaller is the CX-30. For even greater efficiency, try the MX-30 PHEV.

And, at the top of the Mazda tree, for the ultimate in luxury, it must be the CX-80...also available with diesel power.

## Nissan get ready to turn a new LEAF

In the next month or so, you'll be able to place an order for a car which was a world leader.

The original Nissan LEAF, built in Sunderland and launched in 2010, was the world's first mass-market electric car. It was a huge success and, for many of you reading this, was probably the first electric car you drove. 700,000 LEAFs were sold around the world...but the time has come for the car to be fully re-worked.

And here it is.

Range is a hugely impressive 375 miles. The latest battery technology means you can add up to 260 miles of range in under half an hour. It's worth pointing out that the batteries are built by AESC UK whose factory is next door to the Nissan plant.

Nissan is a leader in electric cars...the third generation of the Nissan LEAF will



enhance their reputation of building EVs that really do offer 'real world' motoring.

Of course, the LEAF isn't the only vehicle to be built at the Sunderland Nissan plant. There's also the hugely popular Qashgai and Juke.

Both models continue to evolve. As we go to print, both the Qashqai and Juke are in the UK's top five sellers list. In June 2025 the Qashqai was top of the tree...No.1. Which is no surprise because new variations of the Qashqai keep it fresh.

The latest generation has just received a boost in the form of new e-POWER. Nissan refer to this as 'game changing technology.' What that means is lower fuel consumption, fewer emissions and a quieter ride which Nissan say makes the Qashqai e-POWER deliver EV-like refinement.

Use the technology to its full extent and you can achieve a predicted range of 745 miles from the 1.5 litre petrol engine...staggering. Deliveries begin in September. If you're still a bit wary about moving from traditional combustion engine power to full 100 per cent battery power, this could be the





car that provides you with the perfect halfway house. EV driving characteristics ...terrific range...but no worries about having to charge a battery to get home.

Elsewhere in the Nissan range, the Sunderland built Juke has just celebrated its best year of sales…ever.

There's a new all-electric Micra due shortly. This will be the sixth generation of the Micra and will offer up to 253 miles of range.

Throw the Ariya and X-Trail into the mix and you can see that Nissan has something for everyone.



# INEOS GRENADIER - Perfect for those who miss the Defender

If you hark for the old Land Rover Defender and can't hope to stretch your finances to a Mercedes G-Wagen, there is an answer.

The Ineos Grenadier.

This is a vehicle which is built to do a job. Yes, it looks unashamedly like the now defunct Land Rover Defender, but it's equally up to the job of traversing seriously rough terrain as well as being a capable A-B load hauler over longer distances on tarmac.

New models are in the pipeline for Ineos, but at the moment, the brand will soldier on with the Grenadier in two forms

There's the 'normal' Grenadier which looks like the 5-door Land Rover Defender....then there's a double cab pick-up Grenadier which offers a flat-bed

open rear...it's called the Quartermaster.

Prices for the Grenadier and Quartermaster start at £62,495....prices are the same for both models.

Bit of background. Ineos is owned by its Chairman, Jim Ratcliffe, a car enthusiast and experienced adventurer. He made his money from petrochemicals and he's now shedding a lot of that money as a part owner of Manchester Utd. He identified a gap in the market for an uncompromising, rugged 4X4. The Grenadier is designed in Britain and built in Germany. It provides best-in-class offroad capability, durability, and reliability.

The Ineos Grenadier might be viewed as being a bit old school, but that's precisely why it's so attractive and sells so well. It's built to do a job and can take the knocks of being a workhorse. You could also drive across Africa or head to the North pole. It's that sort of vehicle. The phrase is 'fit for purpose.'

You can choose from petrol or diesel power. Needless to say that all-wheel drive is standard. So too is an 8-speed auto 'box.

Put it this way, if you need a car which really can go anywhere, the Ineos Grenadier needs to be top of your list.







## 5 PLAYSTHE NUMBERS GAME

Number 8 to join 3 and 4 at DS Automobiles



When DS was launched here in the UK, it was seen as the posh end of the Citroen range, But things have moved on. DS is now very much a standalone company with its own character and style.

The range is limited to a couple of SUVs DS 3 and DS 4, but waiting in the wings is the DS No.8 (don't call it DS 8...it's number 8) which is an all-electric sleek

The DS 3 and DS 4 have been huge favourites in this country since they were launched. They add a touch of class in an overcrowded section of the car market. It's rare to use the word 'luxury' in small and mid-size SUVs, but that is precisely what these two cars are all about.

The DS 3 has two powerplant options...a 3-cylinder 1.2 litre 134bhp petrol hybrid engine (0-60mph in 9.2 seconds, top speed 126mph and an estimated fuel return of 56.5mpg) or an all-electric version called DS 3 E-Tense which manages 154bhp, 0-60mph in 9.0 seconds and a potential range of 245 miles

Need something larger?...go for the DS 4. It's available with three different power options...hybrid, plug-in hybrid (PHEV) and diesel. Diesel is a muchmaligned fuel. If you do a high-ish mileage and regularly travel with a decent load, it's a brilliant choice.



We like the PHEV. Yes, it's more expensive but you get a punchy 221bhp from a 1.6 litre petrol engine which is helped by an electric motor powered by a rechargeable battery. 0-60mph in 7.7 seconds is good. Economy is excellent because you'll manage 35 miles on electric power only if you go easily.

No matter whether you choose the DS 3 or DS 4, you get a terrific level of standard equipment and one of the cushiest rides around.

However, if you want sleek and luxury, get ready for the DS No.8, an electric long-distance cruiser. On a full charge it'll manage close to 470 miles. You can do a 10-80 per cent boost in under





30 minutes. This car makes electric motoring hugely attractive in every sense of the word. It's one of the most eye-catching cars we've seen for a long time.

If you like to stand out from the crowd and cosset yourself in luxury, the No.8 will be right up your street...or boulevard.

## HEY DACIA, WHAT'S THE BIG IDEA?

#### Dacia Duster goes large, Bigster style.

Dacia is steadily extending its range...and this is the latest model to arrive. The Bigster is Dacia's flagship car.

Dacia has a bit of everything...small electric car called Spring...terrific value and ideal for city dwellers. The Sandero, Sandero Stepway and Duster continue to offer everything that any family could sensibly need as well as being ideal for commuters.

And now there's the Bigster.

As ever, Dacia goes big on price...that's big as in making a big noise about how competitively priced it is.

The interior looks and feels solid... it should cope with plenty of knocks. Handy because these cars are for families.

As with the Bigster's stablemate, the Duster, it's a rather endearing sort of car for the simple reason that, for the price, it's up to the job, is equipped with the essentials, and drives nicely. It's also distinctively styled.

Everything about the Bigster screams Duster...which is no bad thing...except that it's bigger in terms of length to the tune of 220mm. From the front seats forward, it's identical. Rear legroom, when compared to the Duster, is up by



40mm and the boot is bigger by around 100 litres. In other words, the Bigster is roomy and, if you drop the rear seats, can carry some sizeable loads.

The entry level vehicle gets a three-cylinder 1.2 litre engine and front wheel drive. Next up is a 130bhp 1.2 litre with four-wheel drive. It'll get you across boggy or slippery ground.

Top of the heap is a four-cylinder 1.8 litre petrol engine with full hybrid set-up.

We'd go for the top-level Extreme trim because you'll get an opening panoramic sunroof, satellite navigation, 360-degree camera; front, rear and side parking sensors, cruise control with a speed limiter, heated front seats, heated steering wheel, powered tailgate, and dual zone climate control.

You can customise the Bigster. How does a Sleeper Pack with a double bed sound? What about a roof tent? The





centre armrest in the second row can double-up as a backpack. Clever.

Which Bigster would we recommend? Bearing in mind that the most expensive model has a 1.8 litre engine, Extreme trim and it comes in at under thirty grand...which is less than where other chunky SUVs haven't even started..., we'd push the boat out and go for the top of the range vehicle. It's also the most economical. Win win.

Dacia Bigster....it's a Dacia Duster but bigger.

And big on value too. Like the rest of the Dacia range.

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## ALL-NEW AUDI A6 – PREMIER BUSINESS TRAVEL

#### A6 Avant and A6 Saloon, a class act

Certain cars reach iconic status. They become noted for style, versatility, reliability, great driving dynamics, build quality, interior comfort and high standards of equipment.



You can use any of those terms to describe this sixth generation of the Audi A6

The latest A6 continues as both Avant estate and saloon.

There's also a new powertrain on offer referred to as e-hybrid...that's a PHEV to you and I. It's the same set-up as in the Audi A5 and has proved to be hugely popular. There's a 2.0 litre TFSI turbocharged petrol engine with a 7-speed automatic gearbox and four-wheel drive. There's also an electric motor with a rechargeable battery which can give you up to 64 miles of EV-type travel at up to a shade over 80mph before the engine fires up. Impressive.

Total power equates to 295bhp which

provides a 0-60mph time of 6.0 seconds. Top speed is 155mph.

We've tried it...the engine is responsive and provides effortless power whilst also allowing you to make near-silent, fuel free progress around town. You don't know when power switches between electric motor and petrol engine. It really is that smooth.

Oh, and talking of smooth, the A6 Saloon is the smoothest conventionally powered car ever produced by Audi... it has a drag coefficient of 0.23, all of which makes for seriously quiet progress and terrific economy. The official figure is 134mpg. Okay you won't get that, but it still means that if you use the hybrid tech to its full extent, you should easily



get close to something like 60mpg.

As usual, Audi offers a good choice of powertrains. You can go for petrol and diesel as well as the e-hybrid. There's a fully electric A6 e-tron which arrived last year.

We love the Avant version. As with the saloon, you can go for Sport, S Line or Edition 1 trim levels. Along with the e-hybrid mentioned above, the petrol A6 Avant produces 201bhp from its 2.0 litre engine (0-60mph in 8.3 seconds and economy of up to 39.5 mpg) while if you go for the 2.0 litre diesel, you get a 0-60 time of 7.0 seconds and terrific economy estimated to be up to 54.2mpg. If you regularly travel with a decent load and cover a high mileage, the diesel engine makes sense.

Every Audi is well equipped and is dripping in safety gizmos. Build quality is fantastic. Calling it premium is an insult!

The legend continues.



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# FLYING START TO UK SALES FOR JAECOO

JAECOO is still a fairly new name for the UK car buying public, but they're growing fast, and new models are due to arrive within the next few months.

Their current model, the JAECOO 7 (JAECOO means Cool Hunter in English...in case you were interested!) has got off to a seriously strong start here in Blighty and currently ranks as one of the biggest selling hybrid SUVs. This reflects a market trend as buyers continue to favour hybrid power... especially the plug-in versions...over full electrification.

The JAECOO 7 is a handsome SUV with terrific presence. The large front grille makes it stand out from an increasingly dull crowd. Two versions are available... one with straightforward petrol power and another with PHEV (plug-in hybrid electric vehicle) technology. The estimated range is a terrific 745 miles. Two and four-wheel drive models are available.

The entry level petrol model has a 1.6 litre 145 bhp engine under the bonnet which, bearing in mind that this is a sizeable car, manages a return of around 38 mpg.

The PHEV model gets a 1.5 litre engine, but don't forget this version has hybrid power which bumps things up to a healthy 201bhp. If you select electric mode, the JAECOO 7 can travel for 54 miles before the engine bursts into life. Company car drivers should look very closely at this car...it'll make financial

As for the level of kit you can expect.... well the best way to describe it is that you get everything you need. It's loaded...that's why it represents terrific value. And don't forget that you get a 7-year 100,000 mile warranty. How's that for confidence.

What about new models?

An all-electric JAECOO 7 is in the pipeline, but next up for the company is the JAECOO 5 which, as you can guess from the name, is a smaller SUV than the JAECOO 7.

The first JAECOO 5 models arriving in the UK will all be EVs but a 1.6 litre petrol option will arrive in due course.

We're yet to drive the JAECOO 5 but we've been in its sister car...the Omoda 5. The electric motor drives the front wheels and delivers 204bhp. JAECOO reckon the car will manage around 250 miles on a full charge. The 0-60mph time is a brisk 7.2 seconds. A charge from 10-80 per cent takes 30 minutes.

It's a good-looking thing...a miniature JAECOO 7...and, again, in terms of kit, you get the full works. Deliveries are expected by the end of the year.

BYD started life making rechargeable batteries for stuff like smartphones, laptops etc. This gave the company an advantage when, in 2002, they bought a Chinese stateowned car manufacturer. EV batteries are expensive, so making your own keeps costs down. Smart move.

Quick run-down of their range.

BYD concentrates on building electric vehicles...EVs...but they also give buyers an option with a plug-in hybrid electric vehicle...PHEV.

The Seal is one of their most popular models. It arrived in the UK hot on the heels of their first car, the family-sized Atto 3 SUV and compact Dolphin hatchback.

There's now the Dolphin Surf city car... Atto 2 compact SUV...and most recent of all, the BYD Sealion 7 performance SUV.

We love the BYD Seal. It has a seriously upmarket feel and look to it.

Under the sleek body you'll find the same platform as the Atto and Dolphin, but the battery is bigger. If you go for the single-motor Seal, the rear wheels are driven. There's also a dual motor version which gives you all-wheel drive.

The single motor BYD Seal Design model gets 309bhp (0-60 in 5.9 seconds). The dual motor Seal Excellence gets 523bhp (0-60 in 3.8 seconds). BYD reckon both models will easily exceed 300 miles on





a full charge (354 miles for the Design model and 323 for Excellence). If you find a rapid charger, you can charge from 30% to 80% in around 24 minutes.

The interior is dominated by a huge 15.6-inch touchscreen which rotates. The driver display screen is excellent...crystal clear. Oh and the panoramic glass roof makes a statement.

Out on the road there's a choice of Eco, Normal, Sport or Snow driver settings. The first thing you realise is that once you get over the slingshot performance of the Excellence model, the cheaper Design version is just as good to drive... and cheaper. Both come fully loaded with kit and both are great to drive.

The Seal shows that this is a company to watch very closely. The established brands won't admit it, but they're concerned. The BYD Seal really is that good.

And the rest of the range has something for everyone.
